Bibliology	the study of the doctrine of the Bible

Christology	The study of Christ: his human and divine nature; his life and work
Atonement	The doctrine that teaches Christ paid for our sins
Soteriology	The study of the doctrine of salvation
Justification	Those who believe in Christ are declared righteous and belong to God's family
Sanctification	The lifelong process of a believer growing in holiness
Eschatology	The study of "last things;" such as resurrection and the millennium
Pneumatology	The study of the doctrine of the Holy Spirit
Ecclesiology	The study of the doctrine of the church
Anthropology	The study of mankind
Theology Proper	The study of the doctrine of God
